Lord Saturn's positional change occurs once in two and half years and this time it moves from Kadakam (Cancer) to Simma (Leo) Raasi.

What do we mean by Saturn's transit (Sani Peyarchi)?

Planets revolve around the Sun. We who live on earth, however, imagine that the many planets including the Sun are going around us, and so calculate their movements and positions and how they affect us according to the times of our birth. These calculations and predictions are what constitutes the science of astrology. Each planet traverses at its own speed. The astrologers have divided the universe into twelve sectors and have accordingly named them as twelve Raasis. Each of the nine planets (those selected as of significance astrologically) thus go round the 12 raasis at their own speed. Of the planets, it is Saturn (Sani) that dwells the highest number of days in one raasi. This planet resides for about two and a half years in one raasi. Next to it, are Rahu-Kethu which resides for one and a half years in one raasi, Lord Jupiter (Guru) for one year, whilst Mars (Chevvai) for one and half months, Sun (Suryan), Mercury (Puthan) and Venus (Velli) for one month each and Moon (Santhiran) for just two and a half days in one raasi. The Planets which dwell for long periods in one raasi such as Saturn, Rahu-Kethu, accordingly are reckoned to have a greater influence when in transit. Hence, Saturn's transit (Sani Peyarchi) is observed with great importance. As Lord Saturn dwells for about two and a half years in one raasi, it takes thirty years for it to go round the 12 raasis. In otherwords, it would take Saturn 30 years to return to its original starting position. Again, during the two and half years when Lord Saturn dwells, for instance, in Simma raasi, Lord Jupiter and Rahu-Kethu would have changed positions twice and once respectively.

Lord Jupiter (Guru) will transit (Guru Peyarchi) on 7 November 2007 from Viruchika (Scorpio) raasi to Thanusu (Sagitarious) raasi. After that on 30 November 2008, it will move from Thanusu raasi to Makara (Capricorn) raasi. Sri Rahu-Kethu's transit occurs on 9 April 2008, when Lord Rahu moves from Kumba (Aquarius) to Makara raasi and Lord Kethu from Simma (Leo) raasi to Kadaha (Cancer) raasi. As a result of these movements, there will be many good and bad influences, including may difficult times for devotees depending on their ages and times astrologically. Accordingly, if we can undertake to do certain rites/penances (parikaram), we will be able to avoid thosams (bad influences) and obtain the Lord's grace and blessings. Devotees should participate in this Yagham to seek the blessings of Sri Sani Bhagawan.

Benefits from Participating in Maha Yagham

When devotees participate in this Yagham which is being held for the first time in our new temple, Lord Saturn will be greatly gratified in removing thosams (bad influences) afflicting us according to our respective charts and absolving the evil influences (peedaikal). Furthermore, Lord Saturn will bestow benefits in education, career, family harmony, marriage prospects, and child-bearing. At the same time, it will remove all ill-health and give long life, assist in avoidance of many difficulties and enable one to become the recipient of His grace.

How Can I Participate?

1. Devotees may obtain a purnahuthi tray at a cost of \$21 for participating in the Maha Yagham.
2. You may also obtain Ellu Chatti (sesame oil dheepam) at a further cost of \$10.00.
3. You may also purchase milk packet at a cost of \$2.00 each, which will be used for Abishekam.
4. You may also provide the following: gingerly oil, black cotton cloth, black sesame seed, yoghurt, ghee, flowers, sandhanam and other abisheka material.

Raasi: Mesham (Aries) : Sani moves to the 5 th position for Mesha Raasi of the following nakshatrams: Aswini, Bharani, Karthikai (1 st quarter = kaal)	Enthusiastic in life. Success in all efforts undertaken. More opportunities will arise to acquire possessions and wealth. Avoid hasty conclusions. Think and act. Can see progress in life.
Parikaram (Rites to be performed) : Perform Suriya namaskaram in the morning. Do archana to Sri Murugan on Tuesdays.	
Raasi: Vrishabham (Taurus) : Sani moves to the 4 th position. Artthaashdama Sani begins for those born under the nakshatram of Kartikai (2 nd , 3 rd & 4 th quarters = kaal), Rohini and Mirukashirdam (1 st & 2 nd quarters). Parikaram (Rites to be performed) : Do archana to Sri Lakshmi-Narayanar on Wednesdays, recite Sri Vishnu sakasranama and provide financial assistance to temple developments and construction efforts (thiruppani).	
Raasi: Mithunam (Gemini) : The seven and half years Saturn period comes to an end for those born under Mithuna Raasi of the following nakshatram: Mirukashirdam (3 rd & 4 th quarters = kaal), Thiruvaathirai, Punarpusam (1 st , 2 nd & 3 rd quarters = kaal).	Home economy improves and progress will be seen. Improved prospects for acquiring house, property, vehicle and getting a job. Plans will materialise. Marriage prospects and good tidings will come. Benefits will accrue.
Parikaram (Rites to be performed) : Do archana to Sri Saniswaran on Saturdays. On Thursdays, do archana to Sri Guru Bhagawan. Helping the handicapped will be beneficial.	
Raasi: Kadakam (Cancer) : Sani moves into 2 nd position for Kadaka raasi of the following natshatras: Punarpusam (4 th quarter = kaal), Pusam and Ahilyam.. Of the seven and half years Saturn period, there is the last two and a half year period left to go.	Jemma Saturn changes. Mental worries lessen. In home economy, may experience some improvements. Better bodily health. Best not to interfere in other people's affairs. Think and act for good outcomes.
Parikaram (Rites to be performed) : Light sesame oil dheepam and do archana to Sri Saniswaran on Saturdays. Give dakshina/thanam (such as rice, vegetables, etc.) to priests for eight weeks continuously.	
Raasi: Simmam (Leo) : Sani moves into 1 st position for Simma raasi of the following nakshatras: Makam, Puram and Uthiram (1 st quarter = kaal). Of the seven and half year Saturn period, the first two and a half year period is over, while the balance five year period remains.	Unnecessary problems, useless deeds, limitations property-wise could occur. If you act thoughtfully you may achieve good outcomes. At work place, deal carefully with bosses for good results.
Parikaram (Rites to be performed) : Light sesame oil dheepam for Sri Saniswaran. On Mondays, do milk abishekam and archana to Sri Sivan.	
Raasi: Kanni (Virgo) : Sani moves into 12 th position for Kanni raasi of the following nakshatras: Uthiram (2 nd , 3 rd & 4 th quarters = kaal), Astham and Chiththirai (1 st & 2 nd quarters). Seven and a half year Saturn period begins.	Unnecessary expenses, great losses, loss in wealth, ill-health and bodily injury can happen. Since the changed position of the 7 th house is also in direct view of Guru's 8 th position, any mishap can be overcome if one acts with care and caution.
Parikaram (Rites to be performed) : On Saturdays, worship Sri Sani Bhagavan by lighting sesame oil lamp and providing blue-coloured flowers for pooja. Do archana to Sri Anjaneyar weekly. Helping poor families will bring benefits.	
Raasi: Thulam (Libra) : For Thula raasi of the following nakshatras : Chiththirai (3 rd & 4 th quarters = kaal), Suvathi, Visakam (1 st , 2 nd & 3 rd quarters = kaal), Sani moves into the 11 th position which is beneficial.	Progress in life, debt problems will be over. Acquisition of house, vehicle, gold and possessions. Steady job, will be praised, long-lasting worries will be over. Very good period.
Parikaram (Rites to be performed) : On Saturdays, bring thulasi (holy basil) garlands for Sri Narayanar. Donate cloths and serve food.	
Raasi: Vrishikam (Scorpio) : Sani moves into 10 th position, which is blessed position (Bhakiastanam), for Viruchika raasi of the following nakshatras: Visakam (4 th quarter), Anusham and Keddai.	Job and economic position will be good. In the work place, a dull environment (manthamaana nilai) may arise, so be alert and act with caution. Have patience and think before you act.
Parikaram (Rites to be performed) : On Sundays, do archana to Sri Suriya Bhagavan. Fast on Karthikai and Sashti and do archanas to Sri Murugan and to Sri Sivan for good outcomes.	
Raasi: Dhanusu (Sagitarious) : Sani moves into the 9 th position for Dhanusu raasi of the following nakshatras: Moolam, Puradam and Utthiram (1 st quarter = kaal).	Progress in economic position. Buying house and property. Doing kiraha abiviruthi. Victory in court cases. From a sorrowful past, you may move to a time which may be free from mental worries.
Parikaram (Rites to be performed) : On Thursdays, do archana to Sri Guru Bhagavan with a garland of gram (kondakadalai). Do archana to Sri Lakshmi-Narayanar with a thulasi garland on Saturdays.	
Raasi: Makaram (Capricorn) : Sani moves into 8 th position for Makara raasi of the following nakshatras: Utthiradam (2 nd , 3 rd & 4 th quarters = kaal), Tirukonam and Aviddam (1 st & 2 nd quarters = kaal). Ashtama Sani begins.	Dreams may not be fulfilled. Planned action will be stopped short of fulfilment. Economic hardship, deceived by friends, sorrow from siblings, fights in vain, bodily health suffers. Need for care but as Lord Saturn is your raasi's lord, it will not bring bad influences; it will give the benefits of the 8 th house.
Parikaram (Rites to be performed) : On Fridays, light lamp made of lime for Amman (Devi) and do archana. Also prepare garland of limes for Devi. Assist in teaching, engage in temple services and donate food to get benefits.	
Raasi: Kumbham (Aquarius) : Sani moves into 7 th position for Kumbha raasi of the following nakshatras: Aviddam (3 rd & 4 th quarters = kaal), Sathayam and Puraddasi (1 st , 2 nd & 3 rd quarters = kaal). The Lord of Kumba raasi is Sri Sani Bhagavan.	Acquire wealth, expenses exceed income, difficult situations may arise at workplace, less harmony in the family, health, problems relating to windiness (Vayu) may happen, many kinds of disturbances may occur, think and act.
Parikaram (Rites to be performed) : Pray to kulatheivam (Family god), archana to Sri Anjanayar for 13 weeks. Participate in Sri Siva's prathosha poojas. These will bring good benefits.	
Raasi: Meenam (Pisces) : Sani moves into 6 th position for Meena raasi of the following nakshatras: Puraddasi (4 th Quarter = kaal), Utthiraddaathi and Revathi.	Will raise living standard, lucky (yogam) benefits will accrue. Will get wealth, prosperity and fame, think and act, problems from hidden enemies will fade away. Good deeds will happen in the family.
Parikaram (Rites to be performed) : Worship Ganapathy (Ganesh), fast on Sankatahara Chaturthi day and participate in the pooja. Doing Ganapathy homam and giving, dakshina to priests will bring good benefits.
